Our first MarinStock Benefit Concert was held to encourage us to give back and to raise funds for families struggling due to the mortgage crises. Thousands of individuals in Marin County are being evicted from their homes due to foreclosure. And with rising rents, many find themselves living with friends, family, in shelters or they are simply homeless.



Numbers of homes in foreclosure do not truly reflect the damage to families . . . the national average for homes is 2.9 people per home so any numbers must be multiplied by that amount. Seniors, parents, children and their pets are uprooted. Keep in mind, please, that it is less expensive to help people stay in their homes than it is to get them back into housing once they have lost their homes.

Produce the Note

"In the past decade, tragic events have befallen Dennis of San Rafael much like dominoes, one after another, including a stroke, loss of loved ones and a divorce. He's now being forced out of his home of 38 years, lost in a foreclosure sale two years after he tried to modify his loan.

"Shuffling through paperwork in a living room bordered by a collection of antique clocks, Dennis, 60, claimed his bank refused valid mortgage payments after he sought refinancing for a lower interest rate, exposing his property to the auction block months ago without his knowledge.

"Asked to explain why the bank refused Dennis' payments when no modification was done, Hammond responded in an e-mail that "monthly payments not equal to the amounts specified in the original contract (partial payments) would not be accepted." Bank officials would not confirm whether the rejected payments were partial amounts . . .

Last month, state Attorney General Jerry Brown called on 10 major banks and loan servicers including Wells Fargo, Bank of America and J.P. Morgan Chase & Co. to lay out their plans to help homeowners facing the "ticking time bomb" of expected monthly payment increases on pay option adjustable rate mortgages."
